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Disclosing any form of sexual harassment, no matter how long ago it occurred, is a tough conversation. Listen to the student and hear what they have to say-provide non-judgmental support. Ask minimal questions about the 'details' of the situation, but ensure they are safe. Avoid comments that may shift blame on the victim.

Ybu are a Responsible Employee.

This means that you must report all incidents of sexual harassment, including: sexual assault, dating violence, domestic violence, and/or gender-based stalking to the Title IX Coordinator as soon as possible, preferably the same day as the disclosure. The Title IX Coordinator will assess whether the si@lation fall \$00\delta\$ der Title IX jurisdiction or should be referred to another office (such as the Dean of Students Office, or Student Responsibility and Community Standards).

Your only responsibility is to report the information to Title IX.
