## Faculty Senate Meeting Minutes September 15 , 20 20 Zoom Meeting

- Faculty are represented on eight Board of Trustees Sub-Committees. Faculty members are non-voting, attend quarterly meetings, and are invited to provide the Senate with brief reports.
  - o Faculty representatives will provide reports at the October 2020 Senate meeting
  - o The Development Committee has a vacancyfor a faculty representative.
- x CAS Task Forceto advise the provost on options for restructuring of CAS provided a preliminary report to the provost on August 10, 2020. 7 K H U H S R U W ¶ V proposals were primarily focused on CAS and Parks. The report was initially distributed only to CAS and Parks faculty. However, the provost distributed the report to all faculty on August 26, 2020.
  - o A feedback process was established with 4/irtual meetings and a survey

  - o Entering class had 196 new students, student retention was high and at a similar rate of previous years, there was a 3% increse in the number of students of color.
- x Education: Jody Wood
  - Education faculty will hold its first meeting September 16, 2020 and they have been approved to hire a new faculty member in Education Leadership
- x Chaifetz: Nitish Singh
  - o Search for a permanent Dean is nearing the end after a recent on campus visit from the finalist. Faculty are awaiting final decision and approval by President Pestello and Provost.
- x Doisy: Sherry Bicklein
  - o Recent administrative changes have occurred after Dean Wilson stepped down. Tricia Austin will become interim dean. Provost will form a search committee.
  - o Dean Wilson submitted a re-organization plan that mostly affected the role of chairs
- x Trudy Busch Valentine School of Nursing: Karen Moore
  - Search for a permanent dean has resulted in the selection of Danny Willis. Dean Willis is starting to meet with faculty and leaders across units.
- x CPHSJ: Kimberly Enard
  - o First assembly will take place September 16, 2020
- x SPS:
  - o 100% of faculty are using Canvas and are partof the first group of faculty to switch from Blackboard. Process has gone smoothly.

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
