

August 2022 Saint Louis University/YouGov Poll Results

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Saint Louis University and YouGov surveyed 900 likely Missouri voters from August 8 to August 16 about the Missouri U.S. Senaterace, current political issues, abortion policy, to de ne university-wide strategic researchpriorities sponsored by the Saint Louis University ResearchInstitute. The Big Ideas competition provides funding to researchinitiatives that demonstrate broad faculty engagement strong leadership and compelling research plans.

Methodology and Weighting

YouGov interviewed 1228 respondents who were then matched down to a sample of 900 to produce the nal dataset. The respondents were matched to a sampling frame on gender, age, race, and education. The frame was constructed by strati ed sampling from the full 2019 American Community Survey (ACS) 1-year sample with selection within strata by weighted sampling with replacements (using the personweights on the public use le).

The matchedcaseswere weighted to the sampling frame using propensity scores. The matchedcases and the frame were combined and a logistic regressionwas estimated for inclusion in the frame. The propensity scorefunction included age, gender, race/ethnicity, years of education, and region. The propensity scoreswere grouped into deciles of the estimated propensity score in the frame and post strati ed accordingto thesedeciles.

The weights were then post-strati ed on 2016and 2020P residential vote choice, and a four-way strati cation of g enderage (4-categories), ace (4-categories), and e ducation (4-categories), to producethe nal weight.





How would you rate the following...Roads and infrastructure in the State of Missouri?






